## The Ministry

#### THE MINISTRY - OVERVIEW

During our recent process of Honoring Our Past and Creating Our Future (HOPCOF), we clarified the vision for our CommUnity as: "A heart-centered community seeking spiritual awakening and transformation by deepening our connection with God, self, and others." We also defined our values as: "Our God is Love. Our Race is Human. Our Faith is Oneness."

With a long history going back to 1982, Unity of Bloomington began as a study group that evolved into an informal church with a lay ministry in 1987 and became an official Unity church with our first minister in 1989. Having existed as a community for seven years before hiring a minister is critical to understanding Unity of Bloomington. We are a decidedly community-led ministry with a core group of members who feel called to lead in various ways and who are determined that Unity of Bloomington will continue to thrive! In addition to our strong lay ministry, throughout the years our CommUnity has been characterized by our warmth, openness and acceptance of all; the deep but practical messages and vibrant music in our Sunday services; our desire to regularly engage with and listen to our CommUnity to ensure that the needs of our members are being met; our ability to adapt and change as the needs of the CommUnity have shifted; our financial consistency and stewardship; and, of course, our eclectic and delicious pot lucks!

A significant strength of our CommUnity is our physical space. We are adjacent to a lush multi-use pathway that spans the length of the city north-to-south. Our building is a unique two-story structure of 8,816 square feet on 23,000 square feet of beautifully landscaped property. We recently invested in the addition of solar panels on the north side of the property, in keeping with our environmental consciousness. The bottom floor of the building is rented as a morning pre-school throughout the week, and the property includes a fenced-in playground and a parking lot. The sanctuary has an abundance of natural light, vaulted ceilings, an elevated stage, and comfortable fabric-cushioned chairs that can be configured as needed or removed altogether. The facility was built in 1974 and is due for an aesthetic upgrade. We are proceeding slowly and thoughtfully on our aesthetic chapel upgrade project and assume that our new minister will want to give some input.

Another feature of our CommUnity of which we are very proud is our music team. We feature live music at every Sunday service. Musical selections favor New Thought music. However, depending on the message and the request of the minister or guest speaker, the music may include a traditional hymn or a contemporary pop song! When a month has five Sundays, the fifth Sunday is often reserved for a CommUnity favorite all-music service. As the name suggests, the message of the service is given almost entirely in song.

We have had many changes to the vision and leadership of our Youth and Family Ministry over the years, as well as fluctuating participation by families and volunteers. A 2023 survey of our CommUnity surfaced a sadness that we have not been able to stabilize that program, as well as a

strong desire to have the joy and energy of children in our Center again. On Mother's Day, we began a soft launch of a childcare option during the Sunday service, with plans to continue that offering once a month until the demand increases.

Similarly, we have CommUnity members who are trained as Prayer Partners who are available to members after the Sunday service. We currently do not have an active Prayer Partner program with regular responsibilities and ongoing personal development and mentoring, however. We look forward to this program re-starting with our new minister.

Our formal connection to the spiritual community of our city and the surrounding areas is in the form of membership in Monroe County United Ministries (MCUM – see https://mcum.org/). This group connects formal and informal leaders of the various congregations and operates a number of social and economic programs for the county. In addition to MCUM, CommUnity members who are affiliated with other nonprofits in the region often organize fund or material drives at various times of the year.

We communicate with current and future members via our weekly email newsletter, our website, and our closed and open FaceBook groups. Our Sunday services and some workshops/activities/events are livestreamed to both FaceBook and YouTube.

Among the many talents of our members, we are blessed to have technical expertise in audio and video in our CommUnity. During the pandemic, we quickly invested in the necessary technical upgrades and pivoted to offer livestreamed Sunday services that we continue to believe are important, and we are constantly improving. Roughly the same number of people attend in-person as watch a live or recorded version of the service weekly.

Prior to the HOPCOF workshop, we held a number of introspective CommUnity meetings and distributed a survey to help us clarify our vision and define what we want from our future minister. The list below contains the attributes our CommUnity found to be the highest priority for us.

#### Consider applying if you:

- Are a dynamic teacher and speaker who delivers meaningful messaging during Sunday services, classes, and workshops that spiritually feed current members, while being relatable enough to attract new members.
- Have excellent interpersonal communication skills grounded in spiritual principles, listen first and gracefully navigate different points of view.
- Are a strong leader who thrives in a collaborative environment that involves a Board, staff, and volunteers.
- A spiritual facilitator who delights in empowering and awakening the leadership abilities in others.
- Live and lead with prosperity consciousness and are eager to develop that practice in our CommUnity.

 Are confident in your ability to connect others to the Unity message and generate greater awareness of our CommUnity.

As is true of many communities coming out of the pandemic, we are looking forward to gathering together for classes and workshops on the foundations of Unity and New Thought, personal development topics, beginning and advanced metaphysics, A Course in Miracles, and topics trending at Unity Worldwide Ministries. We have a Zoom-based metaphysics group that meets weekly. Recently, we hosted Jill Bolte-Taylor for a short workshop based on her book "Whole Brain Living" that attracted many folks from outside the regular Sunday service attendees. Additionally, two new CommUnity members have begun introductory workshops to A Course in Miracles.

The 2023 CommUnity survey also revealed a budding interest in doing more things in-person together as a CommUnity aside from Sunday Service, including social gatherings, book/writing/art clubs, meditation/healing/chanting groups, and spiritual cinema. We have a regular book club that meets just before the Sunday service. An online yoga class is offered four times/week. In April 2023, a drum circle attracted 20 attendees, and the group has decided to make it a monthly event.

#### Locality:

Bloomington, Indiana is a wonderful city with a population of approximately 85,000. Located in Monroe County, it originally was a farming community with working stone quarries. Farming and limestone quarries continue to be a large influence in the community. https://www.co.monroe.in.us/

#### **Physical Description:**

Bloomington displays all four seasons, with temperatures ranging from 21 to 85 degrees Fahrenheit. Temperatures rarely reach below 6 degrees or above 91 degrees. The landscape is flat lands with hills.

#### <u>Political</u>

Indiana is a conservative state; however, the city of Bloomington is socially and politically progressive. "A blue dot in a red state."

#### Arts

Bloomington is a very artistic community that offers classes and retail sales in many areas of art. An Art Gallery walk is featured downtown on the First Friday of each month. Throughout the year, there are a variety of festivals, including the Lotus World Music Festival, the Limestone Comedy Festival and the Hilly Hundred Bicycle Tour. Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University offers 11,000 opera and concert productions each year, plus many free recitals, and the Indiana University Theatre and Dance departments feature regular productions.

#### Recreation

Monroe County has three lakes available for boating, swimming and fishing. There are numerous state parks and national forests nearby. The B-Line Trail runs north to south through the city, and is

adjacent to the Unity of Bloomington property, allowing bicycling and walking. Bloomington has five golf courses, more than ten fitness centers, and offers birding tours, mountain biking and hunting. (https://bloomington.in.gov/parks)

#### **Economics**

Indiana University is the major employer in Bloomington. Medical technology factories include Boston Scientific, Baxter Manufacturing, Catalent Pharma and Cook Medical Group. The city has two hospitals. Food choices are eclectic and varied, with over 75 restaurants representing 18 different countries, two wineries and six breweries/distilleries.

#### **Transportation**

Monroe County has a category/class C airport with two runways. The Indianapolis International Airport is only an hour away. Public transit is available within the city limits and the county offers a rural transit system. There are many bicycle lanes throughout the city. (https://flymonroecounty.com)

#### **Proximity**

Bloomington is located one hour south of the capital city of Indianapolis, 4-1/2 hours south of Chicago, Illinois, and two hours north of Louisville, Kentucky. Cincinnati, Ohio is 2-1/2 hours to the east and St. Louis, Missouri is four hours to the west.

## **Proximity to Other Unity Ministries and/or New Thought Centers:**

Unity of Bloomington is the only New Thought Spiritual Center in the southern half of Indiana. There is a Unity center in Indianapolis and the city of Louisville, Kentucky has two Unity congregations.
