

Competency Based Learning

Kolb's Experiential Learning Cycle

Used to create Immersive Experiences

Active Concrete Experiencing Experimentation Having the actual experience Trying out what you have learned Abstract Reflective Conceptualization Observation Learning from the experience Reflecting on the experience

Understanding Experiential Learning

The principles of experiential learning are grounded in the idea that individuals learn best through direct, hands-on experiences.

Active Engagement

Learning is most effective when individuals actively engage with the content.







Reflection

Students are encouraged to analyze and interpret their experiences, gaining meaningful insights and understanding

Concrete Experience

Learning involves direct, tangible experiences rather than abstract concepts.








Immediate Application

The goal is to combine theory with practice, ensuring that learning is relevant and useful.

Active Experimentation

Learners are encouraged to apply the new knowledge and skills in different ways.





Personalized Learning

Tailoring experiences to the needs and interests of learners enhances the effectiveness of experiential learning.

Instructor As Facilitator

Instructors play a role as facilitators, guiding the learning process rather than dictating information.








Collaboration & Interaction

Continuous Feedback


Constructive feedback helps learners refine their understanding and skills throughout the learning journey.

Benefits of Experiential Learning

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Enhanced Retention

Learners are more likely to remember and apply concepts encountered in realworld scenarios.



Development of Critical Thinking Skills

Learners develop the skills to analyze situations, make decisions, and adapt to changing circumstances.



Improved Motivation and Engagement

Learners are more motivated to explore and understand topics when they can see the real-world relevance.



Application of Knowledge in Real-world Contexts

Experiential learning bridges the gap between theory and practice.



Holistic Understanding

This multifaceted approach contributes to a deeper and more nuanced comprehension of subject matter.



Development of Soft Skills






Licensed Unity Teacher Program

Moving to Canvas: June 2024


Current Students: 7 students – Cohort based on needs; Projected graduation June 2025




To Receive Credit

The course is divided into 7 modules, each containing learning assignments, discussion questions, graded assignments, and other tools to help guide the learning process.


