PAULETTE PIPE is a gifted mindfulness & meditation teacher, retreat facilitator, and host of the popular meditation and mindfulness and spiritual practices podcast, “Touching the Stillness”, which initially aired on the Unity Online Radio Network for a decade and is now accessible wherever podcasts are available.

A British-born native with a distinctive, mesmerizing voice, Paulette masterfully creates rich, sacred mindfulness experiences that are consciously designed to make the practice of mindfulness and meditation both relevant and accessible for daily application.

In addition to leading retreats, workshops, and extended meditations at venues in the United States and abroad, Paulette also facilitates online prayer and meditation programs and offers an assortment of complimentary prayer and meditation resources on social media platforms and through her organization’s website. She is also the publisher of three beloved guided meditation CDs—Touching the Stillness, Resting in Stillness, and Blissful Stillness.

Paulette is a credentialed journalist who has written as a staff and freelance features writer for various UK business & trade publications, including in the technology and UK fashion industries. Before heading down the ministerial path, she was formerly a professional fund-raising manager (Development Officer) for several medium-sized national UK charities. But she gave up that career to move to Missouri and attend seminary at Unity World Headquarters at Unity Village, where she was ordained in 2001.

Paulette is also a renowned Keeper of the Flame—a circle guardian who uses her prayer consciousness and gift as an empath to anchor and hold sacred space for organizations...and sometimes individuals, too.

For nine years (from 2012-2021), she served as Keeper of the Flame for the Board of Trustees of Unity Worldwide Ministries, where she silently held sacred prayerful space during its deliberations, discussions and decision-making process and acted as liturgist for the conference body during UWM’s Annual General Business Meeting.
