# This is Our Story, This is Our Song! African American History / Storytelling: Group – (Juneteenth origins)

## Becoming a Peacemaker in Our World - (Rev. Suzanne Carter)

#### Offered: Thurs, June 20 (1:30-3:00 pm)

Together we will learn these 4 essential steps:

It begins with me. Just as the song says: Let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me. This step is fueled by Divine Love. We will answer the question: WHO AM I UNIQELY

<u>What am I do to?</u> *This step is fueled by Divine Light.* We will answer the question: What is my purpose, my Divine Purpose. What gifts do I have to help fulfill my purpose.

<u>Where am I blocked in fulfilling my purpose?</u> This step is fueled by Divine Life. We will answer the question, what do I need to do to heal this block.

<u>Now What? The road to peace.</u> This step is fueled by Divine Connection as Jesus spoke about "Where two or more are gathered". We will answer the question: How to create safe circles of connection with healthy communication.

New ideas will emerge as we create circles of Harmony where everyone's view is honored. In this step, we learn to say YES and NO for without safe structure, nothing true can emerge. In this step, we are willing to know that everyone is welcome to the circle unless their intent is to destroy the circle. This step will enable you to know what to do to keep safety present so new ideas can emerge.

In each step, we will discuss the topic, each person will have 2 or 3 minutes to write about the topic and then we will break into small groups. We will practice these steps so that each attendee can then go back to their church and implement the strategies. All handouts will be provided to take home and use.

In 2015 Shawn debuted his solo stand-up comedy full-length show "Because I Can" at the Metropolitan Room in NYC, for which he received a Broadway World Award for Best Musical Comedy Performer and a MAC Award for Outstanding Spoken Word Artist. He has since done his show around the country and headlined Crystal Cruises. He has also become a featured workshop leader teaching his "Stand-up" workshop at Canyon Ranch Spa in Lenox, Mass. He also headlined as co-emcee at several Unity Conventions.
