**Martin Luther King, Jr. National Historical Park** was established in 1980 to preserve the places where Dr. King was born, lived, worked, ministered, and was buried. Self-guiding facilities include the Visitors' Center, Historic Ebenezer Baptist Church, [The King Center](#)'s Freedom Hall, and the Historic Fire Station No. 6. These points of interest have films, artifacts, and resource materials available for visitors to enjoy. Remember to bring your National Parks Passport book if you collect stamps.



The Museum at [The Carter Center](#) offers a unique experience for the visitor. Through immersive exhibitions of objects, documents, photographs, videos, and beautiful gifts from world leaders, visitors can get a close-up view of the modern American Presidency.

Highlights include a life-size replica of the [Oval Office](#), a dramatic "Day in the Life of the President" presentation on 13-foot screens, a walk-through cabin setting for the crucial Camp David Meetings exhibition, and an Interactive Map Table that takes you with the Carters to monitor elections and fight diseases.



For lunch, we will stop at the [Ponce City Market](#). At the heart of Ponce City Market, the Central Food Hall is becoming the most vibrant food hall and market in the Southeast. James Beard Award-winning chefs offer everything from Georgia and Carolinas-caught seafood, to classic burgers, cold-pressed juice, house-made pasta, and freshly milled heirloom grain bread. There will be something for every taste and dietary need.



The [Unity North Atlanta](#) spiritual community is excited to welcome you to our campus and the Global Mandala, an enormous work of art put together by our artist in residence, Sonia Osio. Our entire sanctuary floor will be cleared and thousands of discs from all over the world will be integrated into a stunning visual of humanity's common dream. Circles, decorated with beautiful expressions of hope by children

of all ages, from seven continents and over 40 states are integrated into a spectacular mandala that demonstrates a global desire for peace and unity. The emotion you feel as you silently walk through the labyrinth of possibility and promise is breathtaking.
