#### Course Description

Unity teachings are rooted in the thought and experience of Unity cofounders Charles and Myrtle Fillmore. Students will explore the major books by the Fillmores and learn the foundations and applications of the principles and tools of Unity's co-founders. Explore the terminology and uses of those terms. Students will read, discuss, debate and present their findings about the basic ideas which characterize the Fillmores' contribution to Christian thought.

**Recommended Prerequisite:** HTS 201 Introduction to Theology: A Metaphysical Perspective

#### Course Learning Objectives

Upon completion of this course, learners will be able to:

- Gain understanding of, describe and present how Charles and Myrtle Fillmore used specific terms found in their writings.
- Research and present a summary of teachings found in unpublished Fillmore writings.

- Research and present a summary of the “To Dos” and “How Tos” found in a specific text by either Charles or Myrtle Fillmore.
- Articulate the Unity teachings they discover during their research.
- Critique what they read and discovered then compare to their current belief system.
- Find the spiritual, practical applications found in the writings of Charles and Myrtle Fillmore.
